Old Business: Keith Butler reported on the Rose outing that took place on Sunday, June 28th, at the A&P in Oak Ridge. Working alone, he was able to collect \$957.60. Art Williams is set to do a September 19 outing at Stop & Shop in Madison. On Saturday, August 22, the Rose outing will be at Pathmark in Lake Hopatcong. Volunteers are needed to run some further Rose Program events. Bob Beck also stressed the importance of the Rose Program stating it is a source of income for our many activities. He thanked Keith for what he has done for the Rose Program.

A thank you went out to Charlene and Art Bowie for the donation of a tent. It is currently housed in the American Legion's shed along with rose supplies.

Art Bowie spoke about the upcoming Golf Outing on Thursday, July 23. He mentioned that they were behind on golfers but doing well with donations. A friend of Art donated \$5,000 in memory of his wife's father who recently passed away. The father served both in WWII and Korea. Eddie Neas donated 4 tickets he received from a friend for the Yankees & Blue Jays game on September 11 that will be used for the Silent Auction. Art showed everyone the T-shirt that will be given at the Golf Outing. If you are able to volunteer to help, see him or Charlene after the meeting.

Keith Butler spoke about the trip to 8<sup>th</sup> & I that he and Pete Gallo arranged. He felt it was a perfect trip. He has about 200 photos and a video he will have on the website. He thanked Tom Miller & Bob Beck for taking care of supplying food and drinks. Our driver of the bus was a marine.

Keith Butler indicated that he had gone to the Beef Steak Fundraiser for U.S. Marine Nick Taylor held on June 19 in Little Falls.

**New Business:** Bob Beck indicated that he approved \$300 for the Family Day For Future Marines. However, an additional \$200 was needed. The vote to give the remaining \$200 was approved.

Keith Butler is looking into Guitars for Vets, an organization that works with the VA. They purchase guitars and give them to veterans suffering from PTSD along with free lessons. He will get more information.

Good of the League: Eddie Neas indicated that there were no new injured or wounded coming into the Hospital. He may do a trip sometime this summer. He mentioned that Diana Williams, a newscaster on Channel 7, whose son was in a serious car accident will be sent to Bethesda. He will check to see if they can make contact with him. In September there will be another Wounded Warriors Battalion East Symposium at Camp Lejeune. He doesn't have dates yet but will present it at the August meeting.

Eddie Neas introduced Barry Fixler who spoke about his tour of duty in 1968 at Khe Sanh, Vietnam, a 77 day siege. His book, Semper Cool took almost 5 years to write. One hundred percent of the funds go to the severely wounded from the Iraq and Afghanistan wars. One example was Brendan Marrocco who lost all four limbs and he received a \$5,000 donation from the Foundation. If you purchase the book from Amazon or Barnes and Noble, the book keeps getting ratings and they keep printing it. They also have to put a percent of the sales of this book directly into his Foundation.

Eddie Neas gave Barry Fixler a MCL coin for all he does. He also made a motion to give a donation to Barry's Foundation. It was voted on and the amount of \$2,500 was approved which will come from Marines Care.
